UPDATES

Happy National Public Health Week!! Please know how very much you are appreciated this week and every week!

We understand **funding cuts and uncertainty** continue to weigh on your mind. Director Willson issued the following statement in regards to the funding cuts.

The Department of Health and Senior Services (DHSS) was notified on the morning of March 25 by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention that three funding streams were terminated effective March 24, 2025, at 11:59 p.m. These funding streams total \$255 million.

The termination of this funding impacts a number of projects currently underway supporting Missouri's public health system, totaling about \$135 million.

The funding reduction is anticipated to impact employees of local public health agencies and team members within DHSS who are either partially or fully supported by this federal funding. An additional \$119 million, of which projects were still being determined, was also cut. The majority of the total funding was set to expire July 2026.

DHSS is working to understand the full impact of this federal action and searching for options to carry on some of this work.

You can <u>share your stories</u> with DHSS to help explain how funding cuts affect local public health services and the health of Missourians in your jurisdiction.

Please use the previous report that you submitted by clicking the QE 03-25 tab at the bottom of the sheet to insert this quarter expenditures. All forms must be signed and submitted via email to CLPHSCHIPHSIReports@health.mo.gov. The form will allow an electronic signature to certify expenditures.

PHIG Evaluation Monitoring Assessment changes are now in effect to 1) collect better quality data that was less prone to reporting error, 2) adjust to a new CDC PHIG guidance document released in February, and 3) attempt to make the assessment easier to complete for LPHAs. Updated guidance documents are available on the LPHA Hub under the PHIG Evaluation section of the <u>Contracts page</u>. Look for the <u>NEW!</u> indicator.

<u>Fluoride safety talking points</u> may help you respond to local questions in light of <u>Robert F. Kennedy Jr's</u> recent recommendation that states ban fluoride in drinking water supplies.

As the **measles outbreak** continues in Texas and surrounding states, now is the time to prepare for the first case or cases in Missouri.

- DHSS plans to announce the first case in Missouri through a press release in coordination with the LPHA who is affected. DHSS will run point for media inquiries on that case and as requested by LPHAs in subsequent cases.
- After the first case in Missouri, DHSS will leave announcements up to LPHAs, but will provide support upon request to the DHSS Office of Public Information (OPI).
- Updated measles talking points are attached.

- DHSS is also preparing updated guidance for schools and child care centers in the event of a case or exposure within one of these facilities.

April 13 – 19 is STI Awareness Week. Missouri-specific stats include the following:

- At a state level, Missouri ranks 18th in Chlamydia infection rate (CDC)
- Missouri was 14th for Gonorrhea (CDC)
- Number of infections and rates peaked in 2022 for Chlamydia and Gonorrhea (CDC)
- For Primary and Secondary Syphilis, Missouri ranked 12th (CDC)
- For Primary and Secondary Syphilis, rates and <u>number peaked in 2022</u>, but for total syphilis (including early non-latent, latent, unknown duration, and congenital syphilis) <u>numbers</u> <u>continued to increase in 2023</u> (CDC)
- Missouri ranked 11th for congenital syphilis (CDC)
- Missouri continued to see <u>increased CS cases in 2023</u>. Cases of syphilis in women of childbearing age decreased in 2024. (CDC)

It is updated monthly and can be filtered and sorted. <u>Social media, posters, rack cards, audio files, and more communication resources</u> are also available for download and local use.

The **Friday Facts** will be returning to publication this week. DHSS has been reviewing all internal and external communication, but recognizes that the Friday Facts reaches DHSS staff, students, and a broad group of public health system stakeholders. You may see some duplication with content shared in this Bulletin and on the LPHA Hub, but we want to make sure information is available to you where you are looking for it.

The next **ShowMe WorldCare implementation** is scheduled to occur on Monday, April 28, 2025. This implementation will transition the vectorborne and zoonotic conditions from WebSurv to ShowMe WorldCare. See April 7 email from Tiffany Bayer/Becca Mickels for details.
