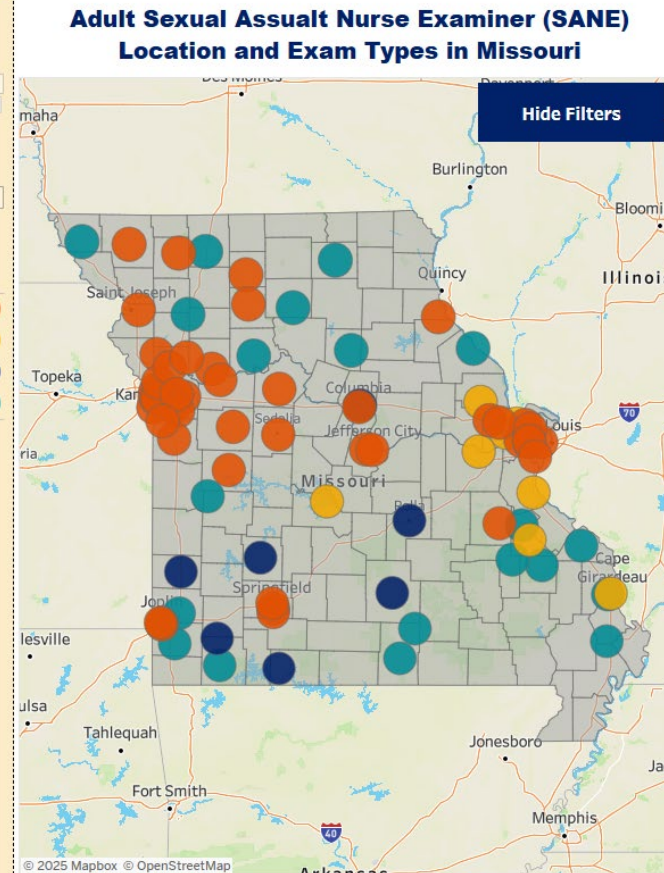

Leading causes of death. Mental health conditions, cardiovascular, infection, amniotic fluid embolism, homicide & hemorrhage.

Deaths that occur after delivery up to one year postpartum.

Pregnancy-related mortality ratio was 2.5 times higher for Black moms than white moms.

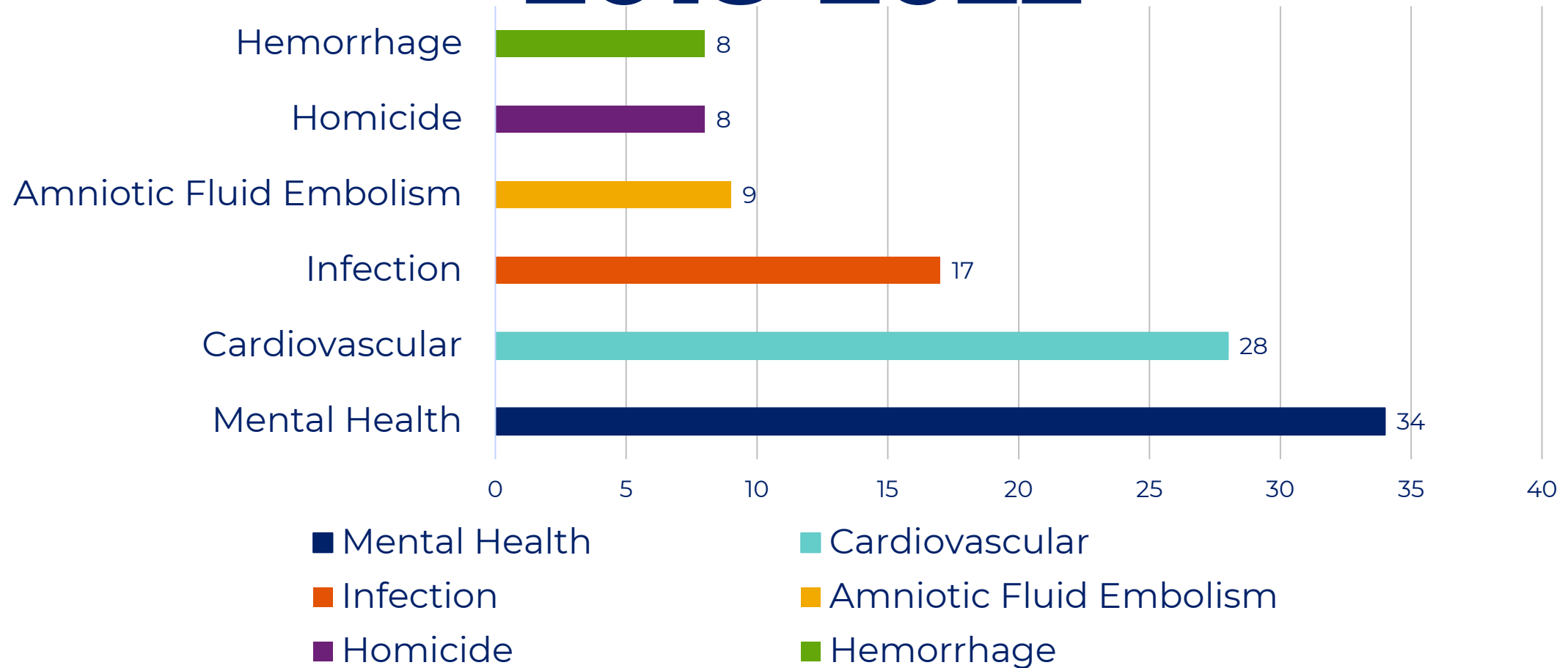

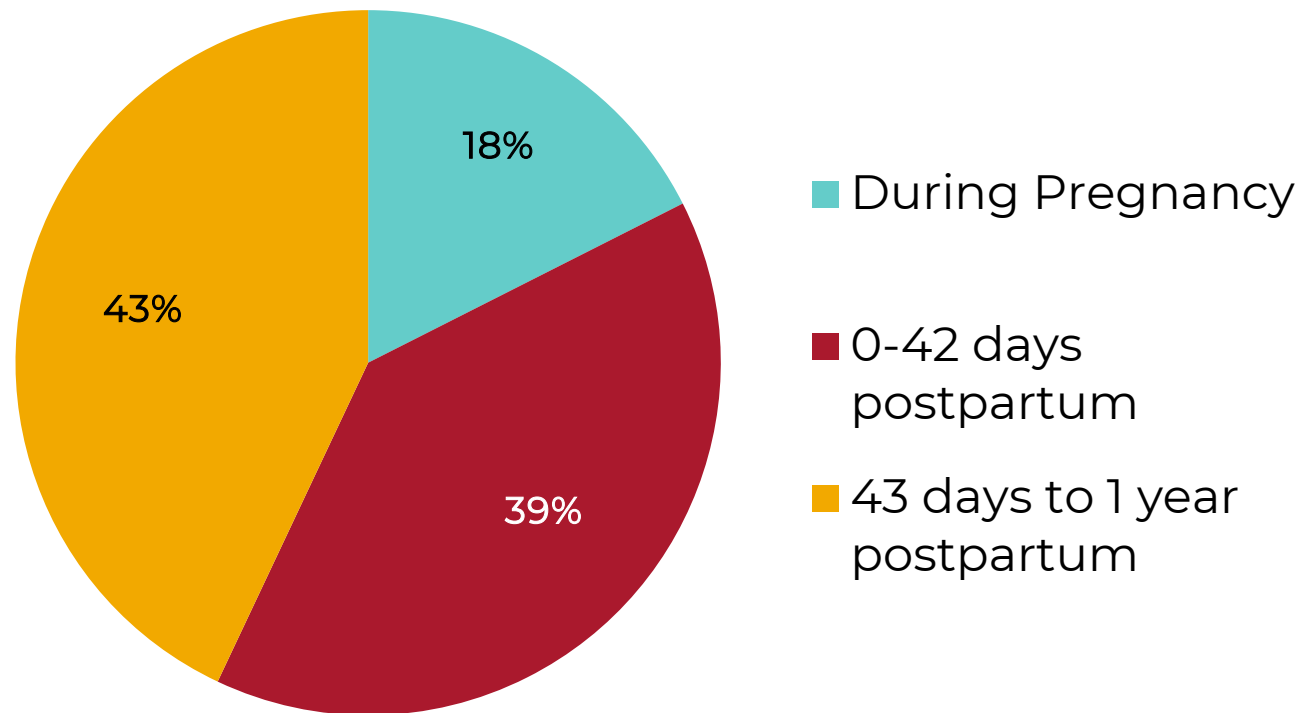
